Course Description: Introductory topics in mathematical analysis with special emphasis on functions including logarithmic, exponential and trigonometric functions.

Required Text: *Algebra and Trigonometry with Analytic Geometry, 12e* by Swokowski and Cole. We will cover chapters 5-8, 10,11 and other topics as time permits.

Calculators: It is expected that everyone have at least a scientific calculator with trigonometric, logarithmic, and exponential functions. It may be helpful to have a graphing calculator to help with visualization, but it is not required to have one. *Since not all students will have graphing calculators, there may be some limited use on some exams or parts of some exams.*
